Community Supports

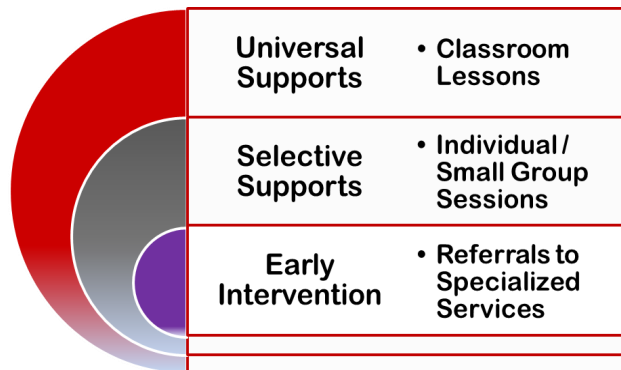
Healthy Start Student Support Program helps children and their families by connecting them to local resources.

Health, social services, mental health and other services may be accessed by contacting the Healthy Start Family Advisor at your child's school.

School Based Supports

The Healthy Start Student Support Program is based upon the Student Assistance Model of school based supports. Family Advisors at each school provide non-academic supports and early interventions for students, including:

- Universal Supports for all students such as classroom lessons for character education and bully prevention.
- Individual and small group sessions for referred students to develop social skills, reduce trauma effects, resolve conflicts and build self-esteem.
- Students experiencing the early onset of a behavioral health condition may be referred to Lutheran Social Services for counseling services.



Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS)

PBIS is a school climate framework that is being implemented at all elementary schools and the middle school.

PBIS teaches students appropriate behaviors and structures school discipline on consistency and high expectations.

Healthy Start Family Advisors participate on each school's PBIS team.

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
